

Wraparound Childcare for Service Families!

We are delighted to have heard that wraparound childcare (WAC) for service pupils is to be rolled out across the UK from Autumn 2022. WAC funding will be available to all eligible Service families with children aged 4 to 11 years. If eligible, Personnel can claim up to 20 hours per week of funding for ach child that is attending before and after school care during term time. More details are said to follow. In the meantime, families who wish to utilise this scheme are encouraged to follow a few steps as detailed on the Naval Families Federation website, which can be accessed by clicking here. At Solent, the onsite wraparound care is provided by Farlington Wraparound Service (FWAS). Once confirmed, you can book your places with FWAS by clicking here and contacting them directly.
